## Nacogdoches S.A.V.E. Coalition and the Family Crisis Center Partner to Commemorate Sexual Assault Awareness Month

April has been declared Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM) in the United States. The goal of SAAM is to raise public awareness of sexual violence and to educate communities and individuals on how to prevent sexual violence. This year's theme is "Superhero-No Cape Required," in hopes to remind the public that community members and victims who speak out against sexual assault are all heroes.

The Nacogdoches S.A.V.E. Coalition, along with the Family Crisis Center of East Texas, is holding public activities throughout April to call attention to this important cause. "Walk a Mile in Her Shoes" kick-off event at Baker Pattillo Student Center, on the SFASU campus, in Nacogdoches will take place on April 16<sup>th</sup> from 11:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. This event is an opportunity for men to raise awareness about the causes, effects, and remediation of men's sexualized violence toward women. Men are asked to walk one mile in women's high heel shoes to better understand and appreciate women's experiences, to create awareness and decrease the potential for violence.

An informational booth will be set up on Monday, April 21, 2014, until April 23, 2014 at the SFASU Student Center from 10 a.m. until 1 p.m. There, students will pass out handbills of events, buttons, and brochures to SFASU students to get them involved in SAAM. Friday April 25, 2014 will spotlight Sexual Assault Awareness Month through the "TAKE BACK THE NIGHT" event at Pecan Park in Nacogdoches. Take Back the Night is an interactive event that creates awareness, empowers survivors, and educates the community. The event will start at 7 p.m. and includes a lantern release, as well as comments from guest speakers and march through the park. Registration for the event will begin at 6:30 p.m. "Refuse to be a Victim," a free women's self defense class at the Nacogdoches Recreation Center on April 26<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m., will wrap up the month's events.
