Battering Intervention and Prevention Program (BIPP)

- Counseling for family violence offenders, in which offenders are held accountable for past abusive behavior and taught the fundamentals of leading a nonviolent lifestyle.
- Enhances the safety of victims and holds batterers accountable for their abusive behaviors.
- Goal is to enhance the safety of battered women, men and their children.

FAMILY VIOLENCE STATISTICS

- The annual number of women killed in Texas due to domestic violence has increased each year since 2011, with 132 fatalities in 2014. The youngest victim was 16 and the oldest was 90.
- 185,373 Hotline calls concerning domestic violence were answered last year.
- Last year, 185,817 family violence incidents were reported.

SEXUAL ASSAULT STATISTICS

- Every 107 seconds an American is sexually assaulted.
- Approximately 4 of every 5 rapes were committed by someone known to the victim.
- Approximately 50% of all reported rape/sexual assault incidents occurred at the victim's home or within one mile of their home.
- 1 out of every 6 American women have been the victim of rape or an attempted rape.
- 79% of female victims of rape report that they were first raped before age 25.
- 28% of male victims of rape report that they were first raped at age 10 or younger.
- 81% of women and 35% of men report significant short-term or long-term impacts such as Post Traumatic Stress.
